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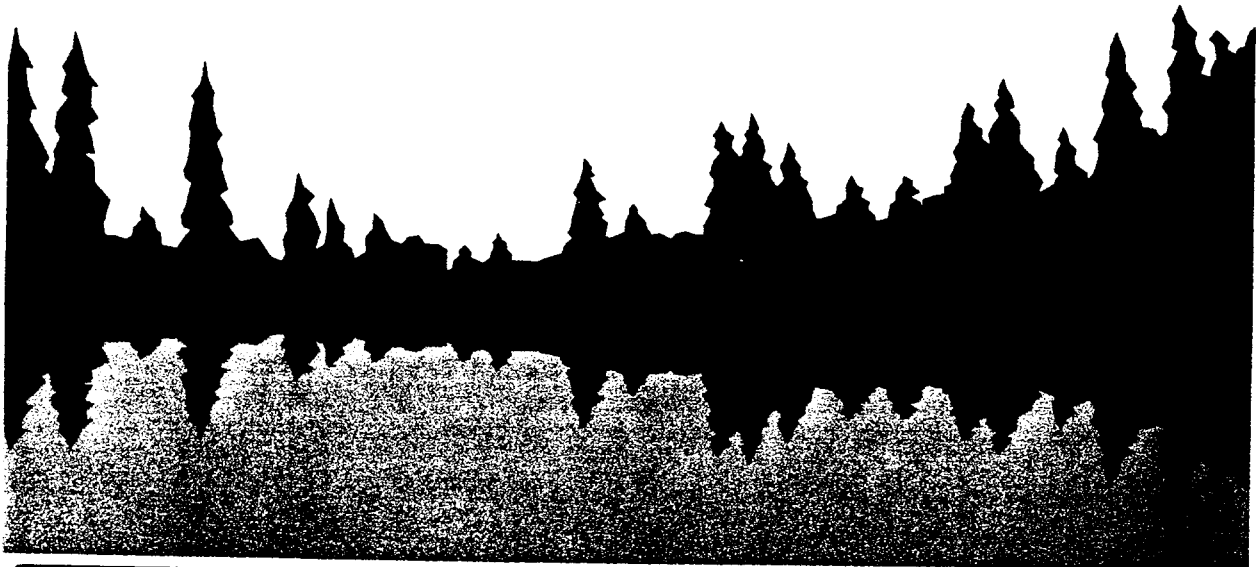

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1. OBTAINING A LICENCE

A) ABOUT THE AURORA RESEARCH INSTITUTE

The Science Institute of the Northwest Territories was created by the NWT Legislative Assembly in 1984. In 1995 the science Institute of the Northwest Territories divided and merged with the Nunavut Arctic College in eastern NWT and the Aurora College in western NWT. Licensing under the *NWT Scientists Act* in the western NWT is handled by Aurora Research Institute (MU) in Inuvik. Licensing in Nunavut is handled through Nunavut Research Institute (Refer to Figure 1 for boundary delineation). For more information on research licensing contact:

AR-I's mandate is to improve the quality of life for NWT'S residents by applying scientific, technological and indigenous knowledge to solve northern problems and advance social and economic goals. As such, ARI is responsible for:

- ◆ licensing and coordinating research in accordance with the *NWT Scientists Act* (Appendix A);
- ◆ promoting communication between researchers and the people of the communities in which they work;
- ◆ promoting public awareness of the importance of science, technology and indigenous knowledge;
- ◆ fostering a scientific community within the NWT which recognizes and uses the traditional knowledge of northern aboriginal peoples;
- ◆ making scientific and traditional knowledge available to people of the NWT; and
- ◆ supporting or conducting research which contributes to the social, cultural and economic prosperity of the people of the NWT.

B) LICENSING YOUR RESEARCH

Without exception, all research in the NWT must be licensed. This includes work in indigenous knowledge as well as in the physical, social and biological sciences. Through the licensing process, information about your work is shared with other researchers and northern residents. Summaries of the research conducted each year are distributed to media, community organizations and other researchers. In addition, research information is added to existing and developing scientific databases. Depending on the research subject, you will require at least one of the following three licences:

1) Wildlife Research Permit *

Research studies on **land animals** (any species of terrestrial vertebrates including polar bears and Migratory birds) or **wildlife habitats** require a Wildlife Research Permit under the *NWT Wildlife Act*. Apply to:

Researchers who wish to work inside an NWT Migratory Bird Sanctuary or designated Wildlife Area, or wish to conduct research on migratory birds, will require in addition to a Wildlife Research Permit, a Migratory Birds and Wildlife Areas - Scientific/Avicultural Permit from:

2) Archaeologists Permit *

Research studies in **archaeology** require an Archaeologists Permit under the *NWT Archaeological Sites Regulations*. (Note that anthropological studies not involving archaeology require a Scientific Research License and not an Archaeologists Permit). For an Archaeologists Permit apply to:

3) Scientific Research Licence *

Research that does not fall under Wildlife or Archaeologist legislation requires a Scientific Research License under the *NWT Scientists Act*. For the western NWT, this license is obtained through ARI in Inuvik. See the back of this manual for Research Licence Application.

If your research will involve **health, contaminants, fisheries, or National Parks**, see page 8 for more information on these topics.

To Apply for a Research Licence

- 1) Ensure that your research location is within the western NWT; see Figure 1. If your research will take place in both Nunavut and the western NWT, you will have to apply to both Institutes.
- 2) Determine which land claim area(s) you will be working (see Table 1).
- 3) Begin the process of community consultation by:
 - a) reading pages 6 through 9,
 - b) identifying appropriate community contacts from the Land Claims Region section (pages 10-29), and

* Note: other licenses and permits may also be required in order to conduct your research. Refer to page 8 and Appendix B.

- c) sending a copy of the completed ARI Research License Application to the appropriate contacts along with a covering letter describing your research plans in plain language.
- 4) Submit a copy of the ARI Research License Application, along with the \$100 application processing fee to ARI. If appropriate, also attach documentation from your University Ethics Committee. See page 7 for further information on ethics.
- .5) After receiving letters of response from your consultation or other required documentation, submit copies of these to ARI. If you are having problems with getting responses, please contact the ARI for directions.

Reports on Licensed Research

- 1) Researchers are required to submit a summary report (plain language) to the ARI for each year of the project. A report form is attached to the back of this manual. Copies of this report will also be distributed to the appropriate communities/agencies.
- 2) Researchers are requested to submit copies of any final report(s) produced. This may take the form of a published document, thesis report, or technical report. The final report(s) will be stored in the permanent collection at ARI. This collection is accessible to the community and other researchers. See page 6 & 7 for other ways of sharing your research.

C) RESEARCH IN THE NORTH

Involving Northern residents in research projects

Local residents and visiting researchers have much to offer each other. Northern people have an intimate knowledge of their community and the land. Their knowledge of local conditions and problems, and their access to traditional knowledge, may suggest new directions for research. In addition, the North has changed rapidly and significantly over the last decade. Many residents of the NWT

communities possess high levels of scientific training and knowledge and can provide valuable information and assistance to visiting researchers. As a researcher, you can share your knowledge by speaking at community council meetings, giving talks at schools or providing nontechnical posters to display at local libraries or community centres. Alternately, you can produce a short, informal video of your research with emphasis on your field work and results. Also, you should consider including residents in field trips or hiring them to

assist with your research. If you plan on hiring assistants, ARI staff may be able to provide you with local contacts who do, or have done scientific work in related disciplines or who have specific knowledge in your field.

By communicating your enthusiasm for your research and/or involving residents in your field work, you may motivate local people to participate in science. *Providing residents with an opportunity to participate in or comment on your research not only improves relations between researchers and residents, but also fosters a research-oriented community in the North.*

Researchers are expected to follow ethical principles. You are advised to consult one or more of the following documents:

Community consultation

Community consultation is a vital part of the licensing procedure: **a licence application will not be processed if appropriate community consultation has not taken place.** The source of this approval will depend on the nature of the study. Please take careful note of the following section.

If your project will involve residents of the western NWT as subjects or informants, ARI requires *written confirmation that you have discussed your plans with the agent-v(ies) and/or community(ies) affected and have received approval to proceed.* **In addition, the following information will be required:**

- 1) how are you obtaining informed consent from participants in the study? You are required to submit a copy of any consent form that you will be using;
- 2) how will participant confidentiality be maintained in your research;
- 3) long and short term use and storage of data collected from participants; and
- 4) how will your research be reported to participants and the community.

If your research does not directly involve western NWT residents, it may still have a significant impact on the community(ies). For example, you may be planning to stay in or travel through an area of cultural or economic significance to the community.

Permission will be required from appropriate community organizations (such as members of the local Hunters and Trappers Association). **Please provide documentation of community/ agency consent with your licence application.**

Experience suggests that you should **start the process of consultation at least three months before the date on which you require your licence.** Early consultation allows for such considerations as mailing time, community discussion, and the screening process. If your letter arrives at a time when many community residents are on the land, you may encounter delays in receiving your approval. Addresses of contacts are located in the relevant land claim region section of this guide. You can also contact the Research Liaison at ARI for guidance and assistance.

D) RESEARCH LICENCE SPECIAL TOPICS

Contaminant-related research

All research results addressing the occurrence of natural and/or man made contaminants in aquatic, terrestrial or atmospheric systems, must be directed to the NWT Technical Committee on Arctic Contaminants (NWTTAC) *prior* to being made public. This ensures the Government of the NWT has sufficient opportunity to address human health implications for residents. In keeping with this strategy, researchers issued licenses must notify the NWTTAC of their plans to publicise the results of contaminant research well in advance of time of release. Human risk assessments generally take approximately six months to complete. Contact:

Health-related research

All health-related research proposals are reviewed by the NWT Health Research Advisory Committee. This review is to ensure that these proposals meet acceptable scientific and ethical standards and that the procedures of collecting data and disseminating results are adequate. 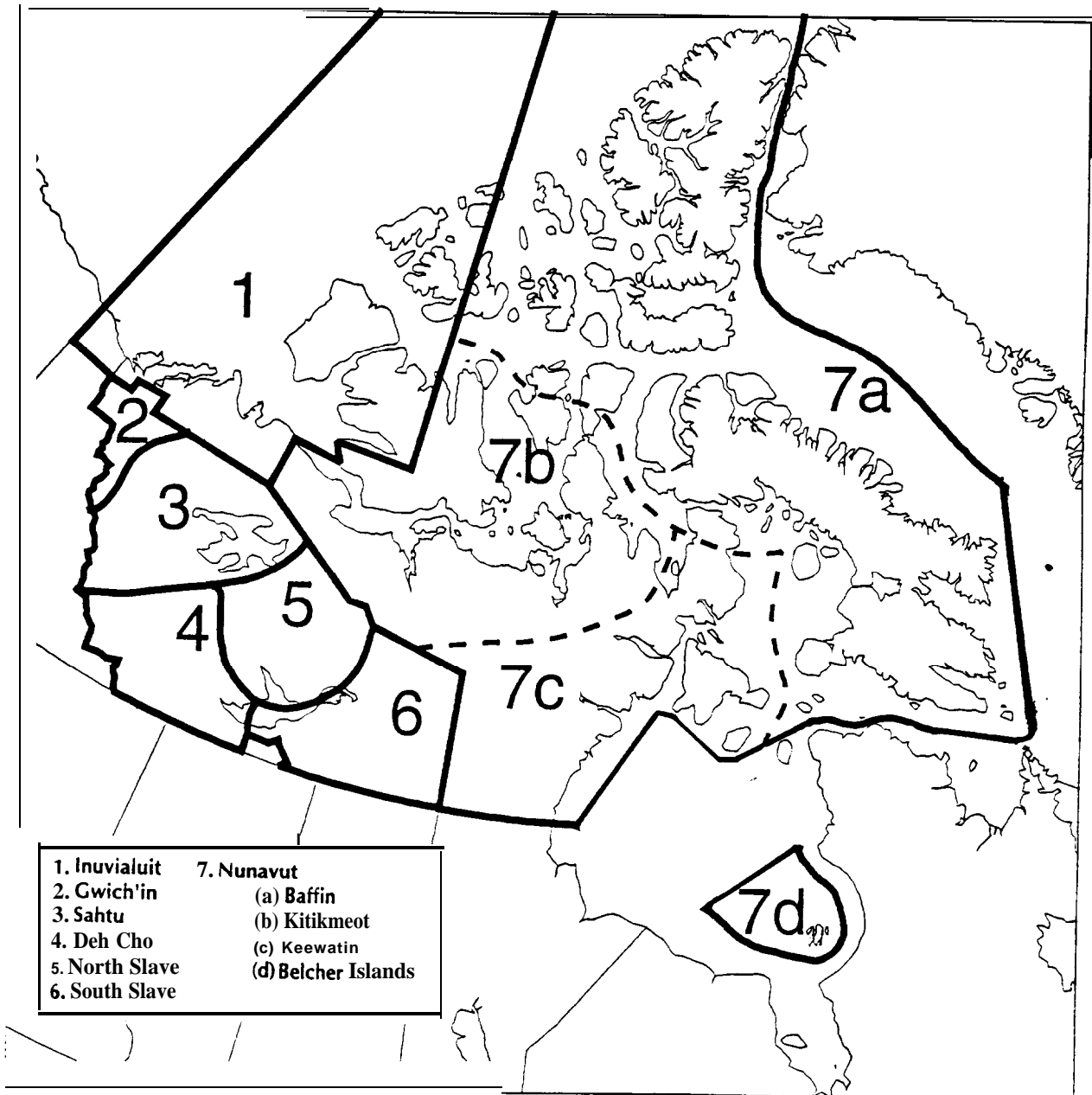

II. LAND CLAIM REGIONS AND COMMUNITY CONTACTS

There are seven Land Claim Regions in the NWT: Inuvialuit, Gwich'in, Deh Cho, North Slave, South Slave, and Nunavut (Figure 1).

Figure 1. Land claim regions in the Northwest Territories*



* Note: Boundaries are approximations intended for reference only. Boundaries for regions 2-6 are subject to change as they represent proposed land claim regions. (Adapted from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada, 1982)

The process of consultation within each of these regions differs due to the different socio-political infrastructures that are in place. Consult Figure 1 to identify which region(s) your research will be conducted in. Refer to Table 1 for communities in each region of the western NWT. Each of the six western regions is further broken down under their own section later in this manual. **You are strongly advised to begin the consultation process before you submit an application for an ARI research licence. The application form enclosed will provide direction for the consultation process and should be referred to. You are advised to allow three months for processing of application.**

A) Inuvialuit settlement Region

The Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA), implemented in 1984, authorized the transfer of ownership of large tracts of land within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region (ISR) from the Government of Canada to the Inuvialuit. The ISR is located in the northwest corner of the NWT and the northern portion of Yukon. The ISR is divided into Crown Lands and Inuvialuit Private Lands. The Inuvialuit Private Lands are further divided into lands in which the Inuvialuit have ownership of surface and subsurface minerals referred to as class 7(1)(a) lands, and lands with only surface rights referred to as 7(1)(b) lands. Depending on whether your research is on Inuvialuit Private Lands or Crown Lands, you will have to follow a different procedure for access. Documentation of consultation and consent by appropriate agencies is required for the issuing of an ARI Research License. Researchers should allow at least three months for consultation, screening and the processing of research applications.

1) Crown Lands

If your research takes place on Crown Land in or adjacent to the ISR (see Figure 2) you are required to contact the Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) to determine whether or not your activity will need to be assessed for potential environmental impacts. The EISC is one of five co-management bodies established under the IFA. These co-management bodies are part of the resource management regime in the ISR. Each board serves to jointly manage resources on land within the ISR.

A copy of your ARI Research License Application should be sent to the EISC for consideration and possible environmental screening. If an environmental screening is required for your research project, the Secretary to the EISC will provide you with the necessary information requirements for completing a project description and making a submission. If your research will extend for a period of greater than 100 person-days, then you will require a Land Use Permit from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (refer to Appendix "B").

2) Inuvialuit Private Lands

3) Community Consultation

Before an ARI Research License is issued, the researcher must consult with the appropriate community organizations. For research into social, cultural or economic aspects, or the testing of people contact the local Community Corporation(s). Research involving land, water or wildlife within the ISR requires approval from the local Hunters and Trappers Committee(s) (HTC).

Any research within the municipal limits requires approval from the **Municipal Council(s)**. See following pages for **community** contacts within the ISR.

Figure 2. Inuvialuit Settlement Region

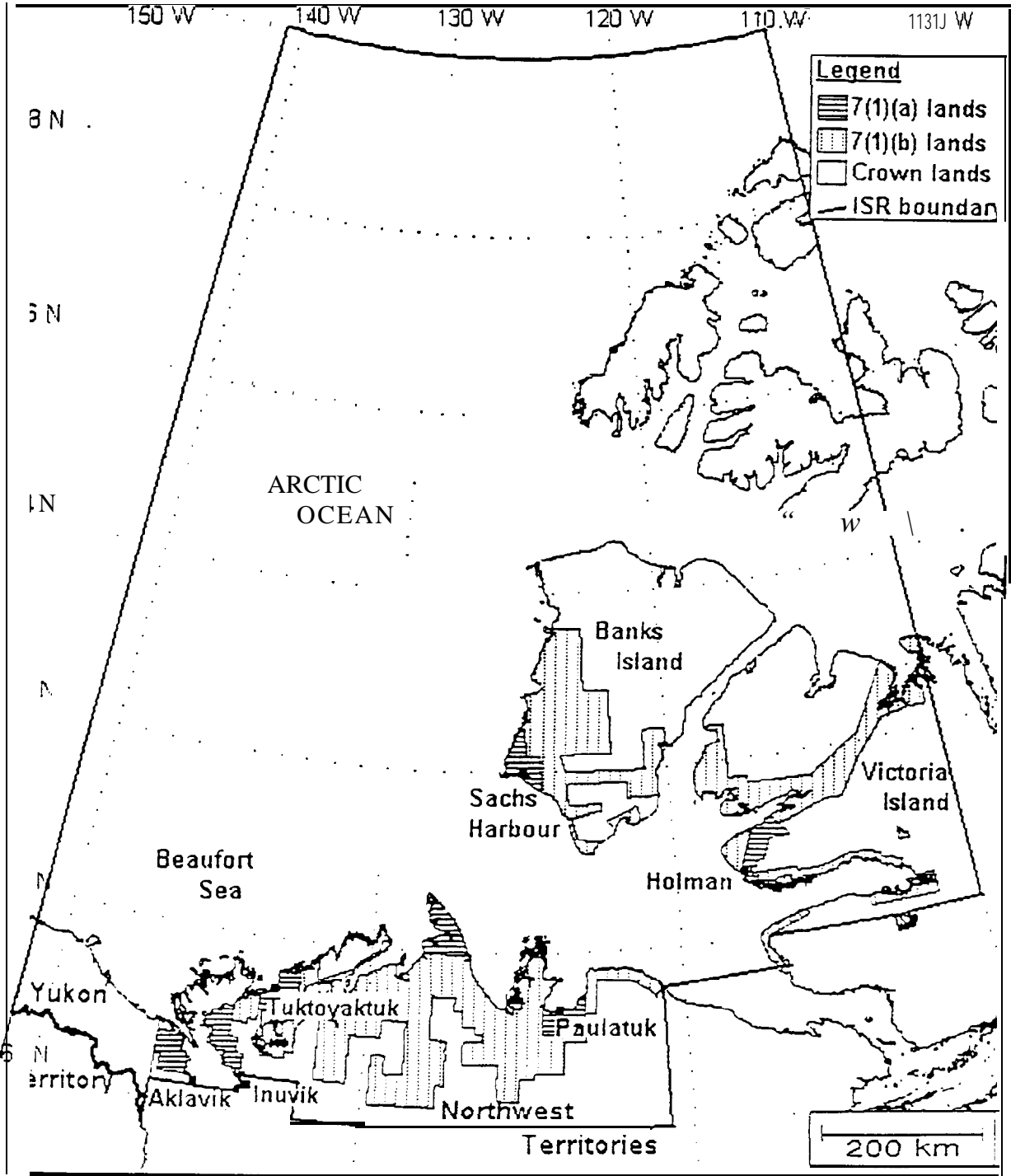

B) Gwich'in Settlement Area

The *Gwich'in Land Claim Settlement Act* of 1992 delineated a parcel of land in and adjacent to the Mackenzie Delta referred to as the Gwich'in Settlement Area (GSA). Along with recognizing certain rights and privileges for Gwich'in people on Crown Land within the GSA, this act also transferred ownership of specific lands to the Gwich'in people. Consult Figure 3 to determine whether your research will be conducted on either Crown or Private Lands within the GSA. Documentation of consultation with and consent by appropriate agencies is required for the issuing of an ARI Research Licence.

1) Crown Lands

Crown Lands within the GSA are jointly managed by various co-management boards and Gwich'in councils. If your research will take place on Crown Lands within the GSA, you should contact the local Renewable Resource Council(s) (RRC) (see following pages for addresses). In addition, if you plan to conduct renewable resource research, you should contact the Gwich'in Renewable Resource Board at the following address:

If your research on Crown Lands will extend for a period of greater than 100 person days, then you require a Land Use Permit. Once established, the Gwich'in Land and Water Board will be responsible for issuing Land Use Permits on Crown Land within the GSA. Until this time, Land Use Permits are available from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (refer to Appendix "B").

2) Gwich'in Private Lands

The Gwich'in Land Claim Settlement Act transferred ownership of approximately 22,422 square kilometres of land in the Mackenzie Delta region to the Gwich'in. For research which requires access to these private lands contact:

3) Community Consultation

Before an ARI Research Licence is issued, the researcher must consult with, and gain approval from the appropriate governing bodies. Research involving land, water or wildlife requires approval from the local RRC(S). For social, cultural or economic aspects, or the testing of people, contact the local Gwich'in Council(s). Figure 3. Gwich'in Settlement Region

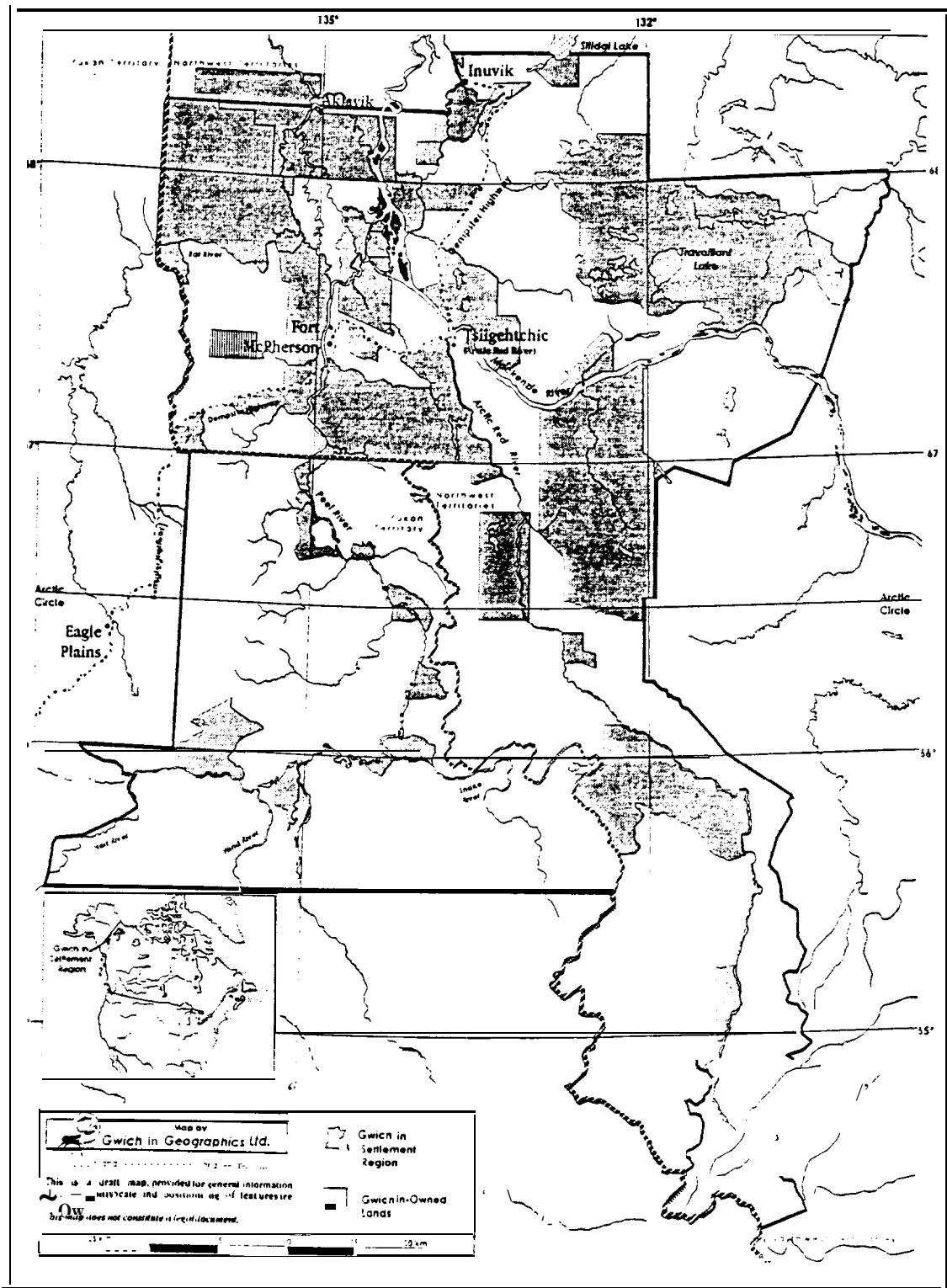

C. Sahtu Settlement Area

The *Sahtu Dene and Metis Land Claim Agreement*, signed in 1993, allocated title of approximately 41,000 square kilometres of land within the Sahtu Settlement Area to the Sahtu Dene and Metis people. This Land Claim Agreement also recognized certain rights and privileges of the Sahtu Dene and Metis people on Crown Lands within the Settlement Area. Figure 4 depicts the boundaries of the Sahtu Settlement Area. Documentation of consultation and consent by appropriate agencies is required for the issuing of an ARI Research Licence.

1) Crown Lands

For research on Crown Lands within the Sahtu Settlement Area you should contact the local Renewable Resource Councils (RRC). If your research on Crown Lands will extend a period of greater than 100 person days, then you will require a Land Use Permit from the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (refer to Appendix "B").

Before a ARI Research Licence is issued, the researcher must consult with, and gain approval from the appropriate governing bodies. For research into social, cultural or economic aspects, or the testing of people contact the Metis Local and/or Band Council(s). Research involving land, water or wildlife requires approval from the local RRC(s). Any research within the municipal limits requires approval from the **Municipal Council**. Figure 4 Sahtu Settlement Area

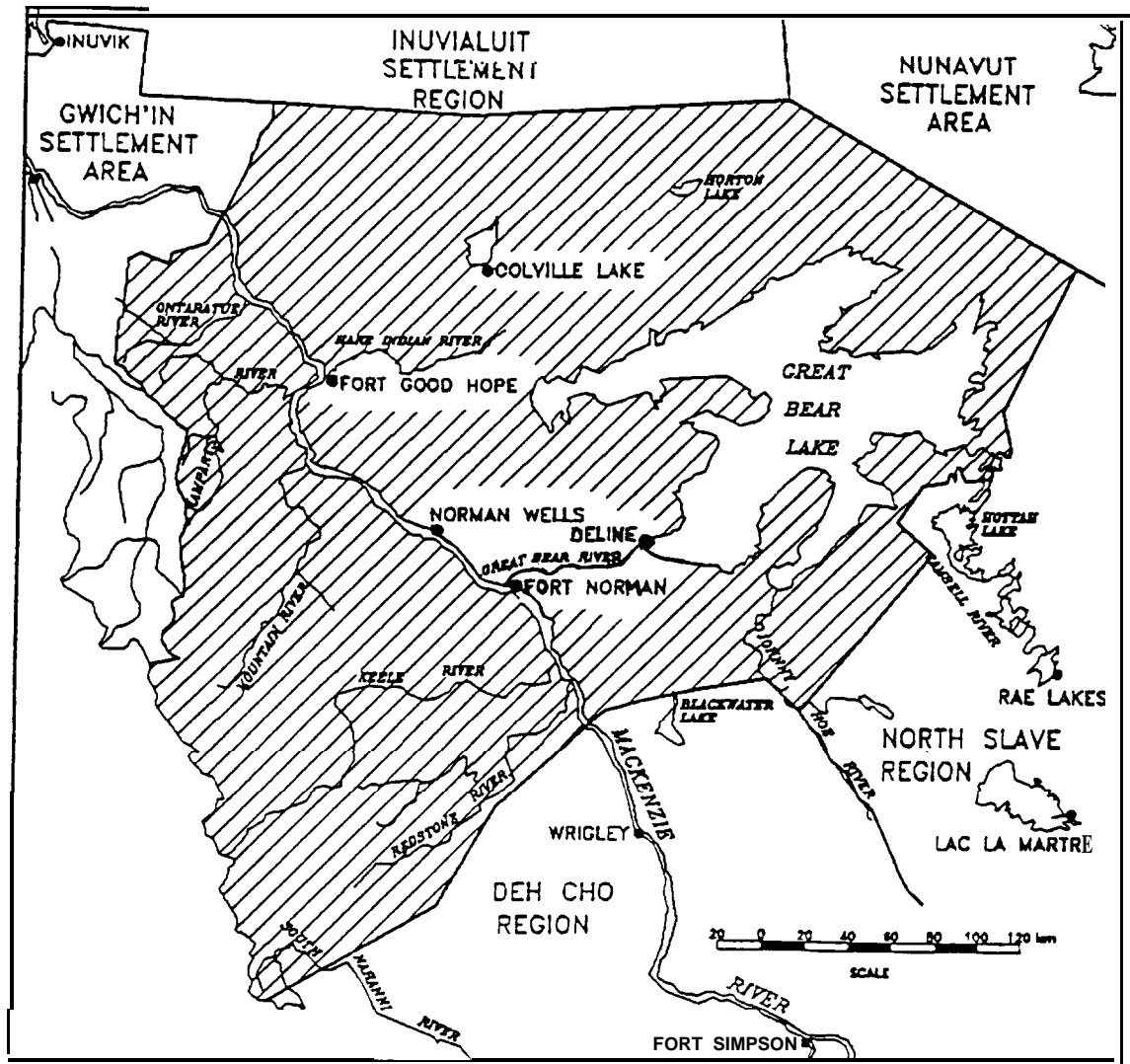

As land claim issues are settled and the appropriate boards and committees are setup in these land claim regions, the consultation process will likely be altered simultaneously. At present, a general guideline for the consultation process for proposed research in Regions 4, 5 and 6 (see Figure 1) are as follows:

- 1) If research is to take place within the municipal limits of the community, contact the Municipal Council(s);
- 2) If research involves community residents, contact the local Band Council(s) and Metis Local(s); and
- 3) If the research is to take place outside the community's municipal limits, contact the local Hunters and Trappers Association (HTA). **If the community does not have a formal HTA, contact the local Band Council and/or Metis Local.**

Many research projects fall into several of the above categories. If you are unsure of the agency you should be consulting with, contact the Research Liaison at ARI. .

111. SUPPORT FOR RESEARCHERS

A. ARI Research Centres

ARI operates two facilities - the Inuvik Research Centre located in Inuvik and the South Slave Research Centre in Fort Smith. These centres provide support to researchers operating in the Inuvik and Fort Smith Regions respectively. The Centres are available to anyone conducting research, regardless of the sponsoring agency.

Researchers with specific questions on the level of support and availability of equipment, accommodation, office and laboratory space should contact the Research Centre managers directly.

1) Inuvik Research Centre

The Inuvik Research Centre has operated since 1964. It is ideally located to support researchers working in the northwestern NWT and northern Yukon. Inuvik acts as a regional centre for the Western Arctic and is located just south of the treeline on the eastern edge of the Mackenzie Delta. With a resident population of 3,206 (1991 Census), Inuvik is accessible via the Dempster Highway or by daily jet service from Edmonton or Yellowknife with Canadian Airlines International and NWT Air.

To date, more than 1600 research projects, involving more than 1000 researchers, have been conducted using the Inuvik facilities. The Inuvik Research Centre operates year-round and can provide researchers with office facilities, access to a research library and laboratories, and accommodation for up to 16 researchers. In addition, the Centre is equipped with storage and freezer facilities and can provide field equipment to researchers. Examples of equipment available include snowmobiles, toboggans, boats and motors, tents, radios, sleeping bags, and camping accessories. contact the manager for a current fee schedule. The Research Centre can provide research and monitoring services on a contractual basis or facilitate the hiring of local research assistants. Appendix A. Scientists Act

CONSOLIDATION OF SCIENTISTS ACT, R.S.N.W.T. 1973, C.S. 4
AS AMENDED BY O.N.W.T. [1978(3)], C.S.S., N.W.T. 1985/91, C.4

This consolidation is not an official statement of the Law. It is prepared for assistance only by the legislative Council, Department of Justice, Government of the Northwest Territories

AN ACT RESPECTING SCIENTISTS

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Scientists Act, 1974(3), c. 10, s. 10.

Application

Non-Application of Act

1A. This Act does not apply to scientific research on wildlife or the collection of specimens of wildlife as defined in the Wildlife Act, 1978(3), c. 8, s. 2.92; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 5.9.

Licences

Issue of licence

2.(1) The Commissioner may issue a licence, subject to such conditions as he may prescribe, authorizing the holders thereof to carry out scientific research based on the Territories.
(2) The Commissioner shall issue a licence within one year of the receipt of the application therefor unless in his opinion to be stated in writing with reasons therefor the research proposed to be carried out might be injurious to or unduly interfere with the natural and social environment of the Territories or any part thereof.

Extension, etc.

(3) The Commissioner may at any time, for any cause that to him seems sufficient, extend, renew, alter, or revoke a licence issued under this section. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 5.2.

Statement of information

3.(1) Every applicant for a licence shall provide accurate statement giving such information on the proposed scientific research as the Commissioner may require.

Change in information

(2) Where any material change takes place subsequent to the provision of the information referred to in subsection (1), the applicant shall forthwith provide corrected information to the Commissioner or a person designated by him. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 5.3.

Authorized required

4. No person shall carry on scientific research in or based on the Territories, or collect specimens in the Territories for use in scientific research, unless

- (a) he is the holder of a subsisting licence issued under this Act; or
- (b) the research consists solely of archaeological work for which a permit has been issued under the Northwest Territories Archaeological Sites Regulations made pursuant to the Northwest Territories Act (Canada). 1974(3), c. 10, s. 4; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 9.

Returns

Returns to Commissioner

5.(1) Every person to whom a licence is issued under this Act shall, within six months of the date on which the licence expires, furnish in duplicate to the Commissioner or a person designated by him

- (a) a report setting forth the scientific work done and the information obtained; and
- (b) such other information as the Commissioner may prescribe.

Extension of time

(2) The Commissioner may as he sees fit extend the time for submission of the returns required under this section. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 5.5; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 9.

Specimens

6. Where a person whom a licence is issued under this Act collects specimens, the Commissioner seems proper. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 5.6; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 9.

Regulations

Regulations

7. The Commissioner may make such regulations as he seems necessary for carrying out the purposes and provisions of this Act. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 5.6; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 9.

Offence and penalty

8. Every person who violates any provision of this act or the regulations or the conditions of a licence issued under this Act is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both. 1974(3), c. 10, s. 8; 1985(1), c. 4, s. 9.
