Mandate

The mandate of Heritage Branch is to provide leadership for the protection, preservation and promotion of provincially significant heritage resources. This is accomplished by direct action and by facilitating community-centered heritage stewardship. The Branch administers the Municipal Heritage Preservation Act and jointly administers the Historic Sites Protection Act with Archaeological Services. It operates 6 provincial historic sites and the Fredericton National Exhibition Centre. The Branch administers the provincial collection of artifacts (25,000) and the provincial inventory of historic buildings (17,000 records). The Heritage Branch is involved with policy development for all aspects of provincial heritage. The Branch promotes awareness of heritage and historic resources through marketing of cultural tourism and programs to support public education.



Services

Community museums and historical societies financial assistance program; technical assistance for museums/historical societies and heritage buildings; designation of provincial historic sites; coordination of Heritage Week.

Legislation

The historic or architectural significance of sites or structures can be recognized provincially and municipally. Provincially, sites are recognized under the Historic Sites Protection Act. Sites can also be protected under this legislation. All kinds of sites can be considered, from native sites to domestic, religious, commercial, institutional and industrial sites of all eras in New Brunswick history. In order for a site to be designated, it should in some way contribute to our understanding of New Brunswick history: it should be a good illustration of a period in history or a style or type of building, and it maybe associated with events or persons of importance to the province. It should not have been significantly altered. When a site is protected, it means that the owner or custodian cannot alter or demolish it unless he or she is the holder of a permit, obtained from the minister responsible. Sites are usually nominated by a member of the public. After a period of research, they are evaluated by a committee and a recommendation is made to the minister responsible.

A municipality may also protect sites or structures of importance by by-law under the Municipal Heritage Preservation Act. A parcel of land, a building, a group of buildings or even several city blocks can be designated. When this happens, they are called Municipal Heritage Preservation Areas, and they are controlled by a Preservation Review Board appointed by the municipality. Thus far, Preservation Areas exist only in Saint John, Fredericton, Bathurst, and Sussex. Moncton is expected to have a Preservation Area in 1996. Mandate

Archaeology Branch's mandate is to provide leadership in the preservation, management and development of New Brunswick's archaeological heritage. This is accomplished by encouraging the stewardship of archaeological heritage resources and by acting as a catalyst to stimulate and foster community participation and awareness of the province's diverse cultural heritage.

The Branch jointly administers the Historic Sites Preservation Act with the Heritage Branch. Archaeological Services also cares for the provincial collection of archaeological artifacts (60,000+), stores a number of collections for third parties (including the New Brunswick Museum, Red Bank, Kingsclear and the Miramichi Natural History Museum) and maintains the provincial inventory of archaeological sites (1000 records). The Archaeological Service Branch is involved with policy development for all aspects of heritage province wide. The Branch encourages fundamental and applied research. It takes a proactive role in heritage management by screening impacts of developmental projects, licensing field research and undertaking inventories and site protection work. The Branch promotes archaeological resource development through promotion, commemoration, site interpretation, publications and exhibitions.

It operates an outdoor museum consisting of 100 historical buildings, over 50,000 artifacts, a nineteenth century landscape along a 50 hectare site on the Saint John River. Parks and Forest Recreation Branch's mandate includes parks planning; the planning and coordination of the Parks Capital Program; the planning and coordinating of policies, regulations, standards and programs for uniform delivery of maintenance and operations programs and services provided to the public: the employment of qualified lifeguards; the management of provincial lands set aside for the development of recreational activities on Crown Lands, as well as initiatives regarding Canadian Heritage Rivers.
